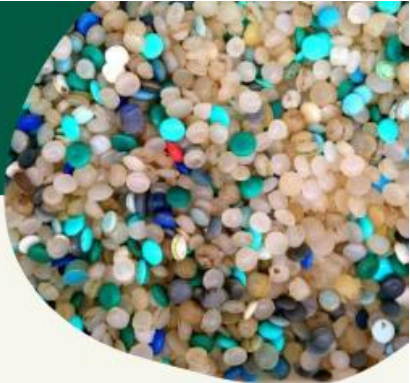
Summer time choices ...
